An Extra-Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday, April 23rd 2018 at 7-30pm in the Peasenhall and Sibton Methodist Meeting Room, Sibton.

2) To receive declarations of interest:

There were no Declarations of Interest.

3) Requests for dispensations:

4) Co-option of Councillors:

b) To receive the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and to note any declarations of interest if co-opted:

5) General Data Protection Requirements:

The Clerk said that he had gained two quotes to be the Council's Data Protection Officer.

The two quotes are:

*Local Council Public Advisory Service: With Visit - £100: Without Visit - £75:
DPO Centre, London: First Year - £600: Second Year Onwards - £300:*

Because the Clerk looks after four Parish Councils, the Clerk obtained a substantial discount from the Local Council Public Advisory Service as the usual quote is 'With a Visit - £300 and Without Visit - £150.

It was agreed to ask the Local Council Public Advisory Service to be the Council's Data Protection Officer 'With a Visit' at a cost of £100.

6) **Planning Matters:**

*Fixed Entrance Signs with back lit lettering:

After considerable discussion with input from a parishioner, the Council decided to look at the lights in question in the dark. With the co-operation and arrangements made by the architect, councillors were able to view the signs with the lights on during the hours of darkness. All councillors agreed that the economic use of light within the design worked very effectively.
