

Sibton Parish Council

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held virtually via Zoom on Monday, November 23rd 2020 at 7pm.

1) Apologies:

Cllr. A. Candler (Vice-Chair) and County and District Cllr. S. Burroughes:

The Clerk said that former Cllr. C. Nicholson had resigned and after a letter on the noticeboard asking parishioners if they wanted an election to fill the vacancy. Ten parishioners did not ask for an election so the Parish Council are now allowed to co-opt a new Councillor.

2) To receive Declarations of Interest and confirm all Members have reviewed their Declaration of Interest Forms: Councillors to declare any Pecuniary or Non-Pecuniary Interests. Members may subsequently declare an interest at any point in the meeting:

4) To receive a report from the County and District Councillor:

7) Sizewell C:

Cllr. D. Sims reported that Suffolk County Council and East Suffolk Council had not liked the number of Heavy Goods Vehicles to be used in the construction of Sizewell C. He said that the Sizewell C Consultation Letter had responded by planning to use more trains and to build a jetty at Sizewell C. Cllr. D. Sims said that these were better proposals but he would still like to see more trains and infrastructure used to construct Sizewell C.

After some discussion including the use of the A1120, it was agreed that Cllr. D. Sims would check on the changes proposed and would write the Parish Council's response to the consultation by December 18th. He was asked to email the response to all councillors before sending it.

The Clerk reported that he had received 'Thank You' Letters and Receipts for the Donations to the Citizens Advice Bureau and the Royal British Legion. He said that the Pensions Regulator Re-Declaration had to be made by March 31st 2021, Suffolk Cloud had offered a Councillor Page and East Suffolk Council Planning had written to report that they had adopted the Suffolk Coastal Local Plan. Finally, the Clerk reported that East Suffolk Council Planning had initiated Planning Consultations on the Statement of Community Involvement, Cycling and Walking and on Recreational Disturbance Avoidance and Migration Strategy Supplementary Planning Document.
