Sibton Parish Council

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held at Sibton & Peasenhall Methodist Church on Monday, January 22nd 2024 at 7pm.

1) Apologies:

There were no apologies.

2) To receive Declarations of Interest and confirm all Members have reviewed their Declaration of Interest Forms: Councillors to declare any Pecuniary or Non-Pecuniary Interests. Members may subsequently declare an interest at any point in the meeting:

Cllr. A. Dale declared a personal interest in the planning applications DC 23 4864 FUL, DC 23 4866 FUL and DC 23 4867 FUL. It was agreed that he would not vote.

Cllr. S. Lear declared a personal interest in the Playing Fields Trust.

3) Requests for dispensations:

There were no requests for dispensations.

4) To receive a report from the County and District Councillors:

District Cllr. J. Ewart reported that she was working with County Cllr. S. Burroughes to solve the issue in Pouy Street and it was hoped that the work required would start in June with County Cllr. S. Burroughes paying some of the cost from his Locality and Highways Budget. District Cllr. J. Ewart said that she would use some of her Enabling Communities Budget to pay for Village Signs. She said that which signs would be funded was still to be decided.

District Cllr. J. Ewart said that she attended a flooding meeting in Framlingham and resident groups were being set up in Framlingham. County Cllr. S. Burroughes reported that he attended a meeting in Framlingham yesterday where two hundred people had attended.

Cllr. A. Levett-Scrivener believed that the Environment Agency was not clear on whether to clear rivers for environmental reasons or to clear them to stop flooding.

County Cllr. S. Burroughes said that he believed that planning applications were needed to clear out the drains. Cllr. A. Dale asked why the authorities did not meet with local parishioners. He said that they seem to want self-help groups but then they are not allowed to do things. District Cllr. J. Ewart said that there was not enough money for the groups to use. It was noted that there was a meeting of the Sizewell Northern Transport Forum on February 6th 2024.

Cllr. A. Dale left the meeting for a few minutes at this point in the meeting to move his car.

County Cllr. S. Burroughes reported that Suffolk County Council had made very difficult decisions over the budget for 2024-2025 and had accepted an overspend of £22 million but had also had to accept a cut in the funding for the Arts. He said that spending on 'Adult Care and Children' was rising very much with just over a thousand children now in the County Council's care and a rising elderly population. County Cllr. S. Burroughes also reported that there was currently a consultation on the libraries service as the current contract to run them was now ending.

County Cllr. S. Burroughes asked if the Parish Council had a view on the Sea Link Project and to perhaps read the Suffolk County Council Report. He also wondered what the Parish Council view was on the proposal to build new pylons to carry electricity across Suffolk.

County Cllr. S. Burroughes reported that Suffolk County Council had agreed to start the work at Pouy Street between April and June 2024. Cllr. S. Lear said that the parishioners affected by the problem should be compensated. There was some discussion on how much volunteers and self-help could do. Cllr. D. Sims asked whether people should be cared for 24 hours a day at their home or in a nursing home. County Cllr. S. Burroughes said that the current policy was that people were cared for at their home for as long as possible. Traffic Management as Sizewell C is built was also discussed.

5) <u>Public Session: Members of the public have fifteen minutes to ask questions</u> on topics on the agenda.

A parishioner informed the meeting that individuals were not allowed to attend the meeting and only a councillor could attend to represent a Parish Council. There was some discussion on how the Parish Council could be represented.

6) <u>To confirm the Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday,</u> November 20th 2023:

7) <u>Village Sign:</u>

County Cllr. S. Burroughes reported that he had a budget of £3000 for replacing signs but this was for statutory signs only. He said that the Parish Council could put up a

sign and County Cllr. S. Burroughes said that he may be able to contribute to the cost. He suggested that a local business would perhaps pay for it.

It was clarified that the Village Sign Base had been built, the Oak Post had also been put up and just the Village Sign needed to put on top of the post.

8) Highways and Speeding:

Cllr. A. Levett-Scrivener reported that the Police Speed Camera Van had visited Sibton recently and many people had been caught exceeding the 30mph speed limit.

9) A1120 Fence:

Cllr. A. Dale said that he had obtained a quote to remove the hedge, put up a new metal fence with posts between the two bridges. He said that the quote was £8990 plus VAT (£1798) so the cost was £10 788.

The Clerk said that he would check with Suffolk Association of Councils (SALC) whether the Parish Council could carry out this work regarding replacing the hedge with a fence and other legalities.

It was agreed to carry out the work subject to checking with SALC.

11) Planning Matters:

<u>Proposal:</u> An Outline Planning Application for tourism development at Cockfield Hall Estate. The application, which includes detailed proposals for the matter of access, (with all other matters to be reserved for future determination), is for the erection of up to 37 cottages/farmsteads (comprising up to 200 beds).

The Parish Council is concerned about the scale of the development and the amount of traffic generated and consequent effect on highway safety by the development.

<u>Proposal:</u> Full detailed planning application for the creation of a water body to be used for irrigation of new forestry plantations, habitat creation, sustainable drainage and recreational use as part of the wider tourism development. The works form part of a comprehensive masterplan for the estate.

<u>Proposal:</u> Full detailed planning application for the creation of two water bodies as part of a larger Landscape masterplan, to hold water within the landscape including the creation of reed bed and wetland habitat. The lakes will provide recreational use and mooring points, associated with the wider tourism development. A new pedestrian bridge will retain the existing public right of way.

<u>Proposal:</u> The proposal is for a ground mount solar PV system with the capacity to generate up to 225.5kWp. The Solar PV systems generated electricity will be exported to the grid, thereby reducing the local electricity networks reliance on fossil fuels whilst also lowering carbon emissions. The estimated annual electricity generation from the ground mounted solar PV system is approximately 259.30MWh/year which equates to a carbon savings of up to 48.4tCO2e/year based on the reduction on reliance on the grid which is equivalent of planting over 2,223 trees. The proposal will therefore contribute towards the regional targets for renewable energy generation.
